PBT ban according to TSCA (Toxic Substances Control Act) section 6(h)

As confirmed by our suppliers, we certify that our printed circuit boards do not contain any of the substances that are considered persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic (PBT). These substances, which are regulated under section 6(h) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), include:

- Decabromodiphenyl ether (decaBDE)
- Phenol, isopropylated phosphate (3:1) (PIP (3:1))
- 2,4,6-Tris(tert-butyl)phenol (2,4,6-TTBP)
- Hexachlorobutadiene (HCBD)
- Pentachlorothiophenol (PCTP)

The TSCA is a US chemical control law that aims to protect human health and the environment from hazardous chemicals. Section 6(h) focuses specifically on the regulation of PBT chemicals through restrictions and safety measures to minimise exposure to these substances.
